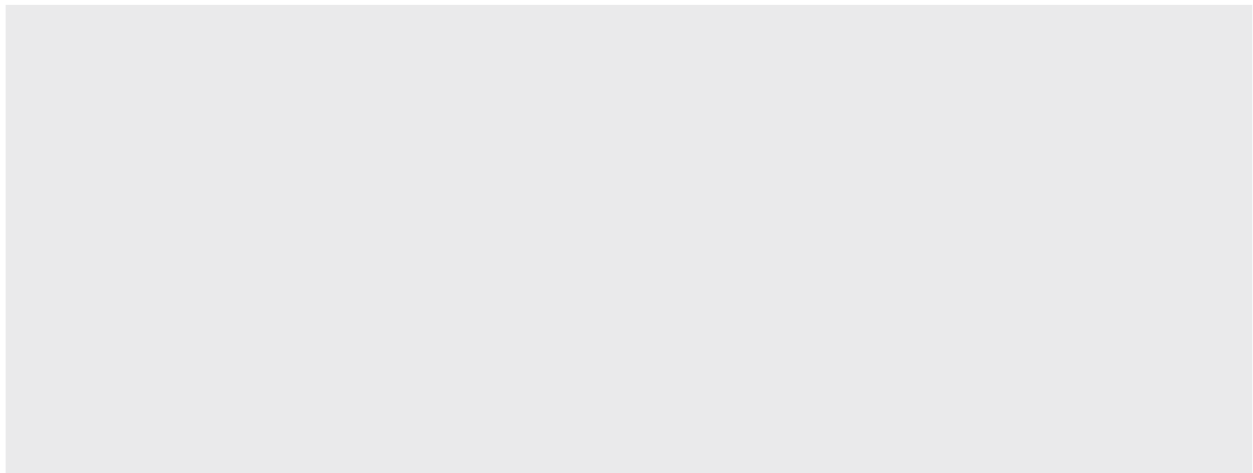

Intentional Emergence Model

- Notice the event.
 - What do you see?
 - What is the situation?
 - Who is involved?
- Understand the problem.
 - What indicates to you that it may be a problem?
 - Is somebody in danger or in trouble?
 - Did someone you know do something unethical?
- Assume personal responsibility.
 - What is telling you to intervene?
 - What ethical decision-making filters are causing you to want to intervene (laws, policies, campus rules, society expectations, Phi Sig expectations, your conscious)?
 - Why is it your responsibility to intervene?
- Know how to help.
 - Can you intervene yourself?
 - Do you need to call 911 or ask someone else for help?
 - Is there a campus resource you can direct someone to?
- Step Up!
 - What do you need to say or do to intervene?
 - How can you take immediate action?
 - When do you need to intervene? Is it an emergency?
