



CHARTERING REQUIREMENTS

A Provisional Group must meet all the following requirements to be eligible for installation and chartering on campus.

Membership and Recruitment

- A provisional chapter must reach IFC average size on campus (no less than 30 men) and retain at least 80% of all recruits.
- A provisional chapter must be trained and use Chapter Builder for all recruitment initiatives.
- All members of a provisional chapter must complete the [PhiredUp Digital Classroom](#) modules to become a certified recruiter.

Scholarship

- The provisional chapter must have an IHQ reviewed scholarship plan that results in a chapter GPA above the campus' All-Male and All-Fraternity average GPA.

Membership Development

- The provisional chapter must host or attend at least two (2) personal/professional development workshops.

Campus and Community Involvement

- 80% of the provisional chapter is expected to be involved in another campus or community organization (work, sports, clubs, etc.).
- 10% of the provisional chapter members need to serve in a leadership capacity within Phi Sigma Kappa (Executive Board and/or committees).

Philanthropy

- A provisional chapter must host at least one (1) philanthropy event per semester and raise a minimum of \$75 per member.
- At least \$1,000 must be raised through the academic year to go towards Special Olympics and/or the Phi Sigma Kappa Foundation.

Community Service

- A provisional chapter must host at least one (1) event per semester and average 15 service hours per member.

Alumni Engagement & Support

- A provisional chapter must produce two (2) newsletters to be sent to parents and alumni, one each semester detailing progress and events.
- A provisional chapter must host a minimum of two (2) parent/alumni events throughout the year.



Communication & Administrative Expectations

- A provisional chapter must maintain appropriate social media according to the Branding and Style Guide.
- A provisional chapter must maintain weekly calls with a member of the Growth Team to discuss progress and receive communication about upcoming deadlines, initiatives, and other pertinent items.

Leadership Development

- A provisional chapter must attend the Conclave: Officer Academy and send at least three (3) members to the summer conference within the first calendar year.
- A provisional chapter must host a leadership retreat for executive board members focusing on calendar planning and strategic goal setting.

Finances

- A provisional chapter must remain in good financial standing throughout the calendar year.
- A provisional chapter must have at least \$2,000 set aside in their savings account.

Programming

- A provisional chapter must follow the Hills and Stars New Member educational programming.
- A provisional chapter must complete the Phi Sigma Kappa Member Safety Program.

Chartering Petition

- A provisional chapter must follow the Fraternity's inclusion statement(s) as listed below:
 - *Phi Sigma Kappa actively promotes and supports policies and practices conforming to federal and state laws against discrimination. Phi Sigma Kappa does not discriminate or conde discrimination in any aspect of its membership, on the basis of race, ethnicity, color, sexual orientation, religion, or other characteristics protected by applicable law.*
 - *Men, including those who live and identify as men, regardless of the sex assigned to them at birth, are eligible for membership in Phi Sigma Kappa. This policy is intended to uphold the mission of Phi Sigma Kappa as a fellowship of men and should not be interpreted as changing the all-male character of the Fraternity or as a waiver of the fraternity's exempt status under Title IX.*
- When the above requirements have been met, a provisional chapter must submit their petition to charter to Phi Sigma Kappa headquarters for consideration and approval.
